



A Message from Pastor Vern

Every spring when I first take my motorcycle out of the shed. I have to review the basics. Can I still balance? Do I remember how to release the clutch and give the proper amount of throttle? Is it still possible for me to lift the bike off its kick stand? And once I get rolling and take to the road, there are a whole other set of things I must remember. Turning requires leaning (watch out fear factor). Did I check the tire pressure and oil level? How much gas do I have? "Oh. I remember what that sand on the corner is like" (more fear factor). What is it I am to do when I stop - put my feet down? And on and on it goes. The learning curve gets steep all over again come March -April & May.

And eventually I remember all that I thought I forgot. And before the season ends I have used what I knew and have learned a new skill or two. Developing and maintaining a set of skills doesn't mean that everything will always turn out okay. But it's best to develop skills. That improves the likelihood of a safe riding season. Gotta keep the confidence level up ya know.

I think that walking with Christ is something like that. Each morning I get up and it's like a new season beginning. Do I remember who Christ is and who I am in Him? Have I reflected on all the lessons He has taught me or am I like a baby just beginning to walk? That really depends on the day. (I am incredibly human)

There are two Scriptures that come to my mind in thinking about these things. The first one is from the letter to the Hebrews -5:11-14

¹¹About this we have much to say, and it is hard to explain, since you have become dull of hearing. 12For though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you again the basic principles of the God. You need milk, not oracles of solid food, ¹³for everyone who lives on milk is unskilled in the word of righteousness, since he is a child. 14But solid food is for the mature, for those who have their powers of discernment trained by constant practice to distinguish good from evil.

I sometimes grow very dull to hearing what the Spirit is saying. And there are occasions when I feel as though I need to be taught again the basic principles of God's Word. I experience times with God which are very similar to my spring-time ritual with the motorcycle.

This may be your experience as well. We can grow dull and lose any discernment we have gained. And what Christian doesn't want to be a wise and gentle follower of Jesus? I sure do.

The second Scripture I was thinking about is found in the 1st letter Paul wrote to the Thessalonians - 5:23-24

²³Now may the God of peace himself sanctify you completely, and may your whole spirit and soul and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. ²⁴He who calls you is faithful; he will surely do it.

This reminds me that it is the Holy Spirit who is at work in me. That began the moment I placed my trust in Christ for the salvation of my soul. Now, that was a few





years ago, but God's Spirit entered into me and is still working in me today. His Spirit is much freer to work in and through me when I obey what I've been commanded to do.

Paul's words speaking of the sanctifying work of the Holy Spirit reminds me of the work of the motorcycle: good tires, good battery, good lights, good brakes, engine in tune. If I take care of these things, that improves my chances of having a safe and sound riding season. Same way, if I do my part in following the Holy Spirit's commands, I improve my level of success in having a healthy and productive life with Christ. We are to co-labor together with Him. And we are to co-labor together with each other. That's like riding my motorcycle: my skills co-laboring together with the motorcycle's fitness for the road.

Keep (find) your balance.

Hopefully this will be a good riding season and good season in Christ.

- 7.Restores us to the *favor* of God
- 8.Deals with *outward* actions-what I've

done

Sanctification:

- 1. What Christ does in us
- 2.Delivers from the *power* of sin
- 3.An inward change in the *heart* of the

believer

- 4. Cleansing of sin
- 5. *Imparted* righteousness
- 6.Change of *nature*
- 7.Restores us to the *image* of God
- 8.Deals with inward nature-who I am.
